The boom in naturalization did not cease with Tuesday, but continued yesterday, and Joe Mannheim is not the only candidate who is increasing the number of citizens so as to get votes. Charles d'Autremont is not behind, and was responsible for the issuance of a number of first papers yesterday in the United States court.
