

District Court Briefs.

John Thornhill sued W W Davis to recover on two promissory notes amounting to \$617 18

Several satisfaction in the matter of the award of commissioners to condemn right of way for the Duluth & Iron Range railroad were filed. They were all for \$1 and less.

In the suit of the Marine National bank vs. W A Montague and T. B. Lazier, the defendant, Montague, filed an answer denying the partnership alleged in the complaint with the co-defendant. The suit was brought to recover on a note held by the plaintiff and claimed in the defendant's answer to be unknown to him.

An appeal from the decision of the lower court was filed in the suits against Edwin A. Lamb, brought by the Highland Improvement company, Walter Auribert and Edoluen Snyder.

By reason of default in payment Outhbert J. Petra asks that the title held to certain lands conveyed by him to Israel Dietostokky, Louis Kohn, Yackel Levin and Joseph Polinsky be declared void.

Judgment for \$119 35 is demanded in the suit of Swan Carlson against Nils Bjork and Conrad Kale.

The court is asked to declare void a mortgage held by Benjamin Gwarkin on certain property owned by Gustave F Piper. The plaintiff avers that he gave Gwarkin a mortgage in consideration for a loan of \$200, on which \$75 is charged as interest. In petitioning that the interest charged be declared usurious, he asks the mortgage be declared void.

A judgment for \$53 60 secured by Leopold Bros., of Minneapolis against Nannie McLachlan, of Duluth, was filed for execution.
