**City Assessors Still Figuring on the Log Taxation Problem.**

SUPERIOR, July 24 —The city assessors are endeavoring to devise some way to assess the large amount of logs cut each year in Douglas county. The old law providing for the assessment of logs on the ground or afloat was all right so far as the assessments were concerned, but when it came to securing the taxes the owners were residents of some other state. The new law provides that logs shall be assessed where manufactured, and while a great many logs are sent out of the county, many more are shipped in and manufactured here, so that an equalization is given. The assessors have solicited legal direction.

The ex-employees of the steel works are engaged in the clearing of the stumps and underbrush on a tract of land belonging to the Land & River Improvement company. This work will be completed in a few weeks.

The Superior Cricket club has received the offer of grounds on the Nemadji by Thomas Furness. New officers have been elected and a challenge has been prepared and sent to the Duluth eleven. The eleven will set up the grounds this week so a game may be played next Sunday if desired.

Five acres of ground has been bought near South Superior by the Hebrew brotherhood of this city. The intention is to convert this land into a cemetery for the special benefit of the brotherhood.
