Isaac Bondy Dead. One of Duluth's Most Successful Merchants ? the Great Majority. News was received yesterday of the death of Isaac Bondy, junior member of the firm of Silberstein & Bondy which occurred on a New York Central train not far from Albany, N.Y. Mr. Bondy left Duluth on Saturday accompanied by Mrs. Bondy and Mr. Silberstein. He was on his way East to consult with a New York specialist regarding his health which for some time past has been precarious. His will was made the day before he left Duluth, showing he had some idea of the seriousness of his condition. The store will be closed until after the funeral which will be held at Rochester N.Y., the home of Mr. Bondy's parents.

Mr. Bondy came to Duluth in 1878 and was a pioneer among Duluth's prominent merchants. Upon his arrival in Duluth he bought out the business of B. Silverstein who returned to St. Paul but who soon came again to Duluth and reengaged in business. After a time the houses were united under the firm name of Silberstein & Bondy and since that time thirteen years the firm has been prominent among Duluth's enterprising and successful commercial institutions.

Mr. Bondy was the buyer for the firm and spent the greater part of the time in New York. He was known to the dry goods trade as buyer of excellent ability and some considerable share of the firm's success was due to his judicious purchases. Mr. Bondy leaves an estate valued at something like a quarter of a million dollars.

Mr. Bond was 40 years of age and leaves surviving a wife, a brother R. L. Bondy, and a sister Mrs. Winterfield in Duluth. He has two sisters Mrs. Friedlander and Mrs. Ryan at Tower, and his parents and a brother and sister are still living in Syracuse. Mrs. Bondy and Mrs. Silberstein are sisters.

Obituary Notes:

Isaac Bondy, wholesale buyer in New York for the dry goods House of Silverstein & Bondy, of Duluth, Minn., died on the New York Central train which reached Albany, N.Y., ten minutes before twelve o'clock yesterday morning. Dr. Florence O'Donohue, president of the State Board of Health, was a passenger on the train and issued a certificate that death was from heart disease. Mr. Bondy was forty years old and in company with his wife and brother-in-law, B. Silverstein, was on his way to Bellevue Hospital this city, for treatment. The body was taken to Syracuse, where the father and brother of Bondy reside.
