

FIRE AT MENANGA.

Four Hundred Thousand Feet of Lumber
Burned.

MENANGA, Minn., Sept. 1.—For several days fierce forest fires have been raging in this vicinity, and it has been only by the united efforts of the people who have worked day and night that the whole town has been kept from burning several times. Sunday and Monday were exciting days. The whole town fought fire with a vigor seldom equalled, and during the afternoon of the latter day they succeeded in getting it pretty well under control. That night, worn out and tired, everyone retired early, but they were unable to secure the much needed rest. Tuesday the citizens were called out and found the Menanga Lumber Co.'s yards on fire. By persistent work it was extinguished after 400,000 feet of lumber had been destroyed. ✕
