

ACCIDENTAL SHOOTING.

A REVOLVER IN THE HANDS OF ALBERT POLINSKY IS DISCHARGED AND THE BULLET LODGES IN JOHN O'CONNOR'S SIDE.

Yesterday afternoon at 3:15 o'clock while Albert Polinsky was examining a revolver offered for sale in the second hand store of Joseph Polinsky & Co., 505 West Superior street, the weapon was accidentally discharged and a bullet was lodged in the side of John O'Connor. The wounded man was taken to St. Mary's hospital and young Polinsky and Richard Wermarck were lodged in Central police station.

About 3 p. m. O'Connor and Wermarck entered the second-hand store and offered the revolver for sale. Wermarck claims that O'Connor cautioned Polinsky about handling the weapon. Polinsky claims that O'Connor assured him it was not loaded.

O'Connor is a laboring man who resides at West Duluth. Dr. Magie was called and dressed the wound. Last evening word came to the News Tribune that the man was in a critical condition and his recovery is in doubt.
