

BECAME SUDDENLY INSANE.

ABRAHAM LEVINE, A FORMER DULUTH CLOTHIER, BROUGHT DOWN FROM TOWER A RAVING MANIAC.

Abraham Levine, who used to conduct the Bell clothing house on Superior street and who for two years has been engaged in the brewery business at Tower, was brought to this city yesterday afternoon, and placed in the county jail, violently insane. The case is a peculiar one. Levine and a friend were standing on the depot platform at Tower a few minutes before the Duluth train departed, when Levine became suddenly insane. The friend coaxed him onto the train and it required the strength of three passengers to control him while enroute here. As it was, he broke the lights in three coach windows. Detective Hayden escorted him to the jail. Levine is well known in Duluth, especially among the retail merchants.
