

CLOTHE THEMSELVES.

Burglars Visit a Clothing Store and Supply Their Personal Needs.

The boldest burglary ever committed in Superior was that of the Karon Bros.' clothing store at the East End early yesterday morning. An entrance was effected through a side window of the establishment after a failure had been made of an attempt to cut a large hole through the back door. The robbers, probably three in number, then pulled down the window curtains, lighted a lamp and went over the stock selecting their sizes in underwear and other clothing after overhauling nearly every box and show case in the store. They carried away about \$100 worth of goods and probably are still journeying in some direction unknown to the police.

When the proprietors opened up the store yesterday morning they found everything in confusion, clothes scattered around the floor and boxes taken from the shelves strewn all over the counters. An invoice was taken immediately which showed that the stock was short of 26 pairs of gloves, seven pairs of German socks, several duck coats, overalls, 11 mackinaws, four mufflers, pocketbooks, 12 suits of underwear, 21 shirts, caps, valises, neckties, shoulder straps, buttons, combs, etc.

The officers have no clue to the perpetrators except the statement of one of the proprietors that two men came into his store Wednesday afternoon to inspect his goods with the apparent expectation of purchasing, that they looked over the stock thoroughly and looked around the building with a greater display of curiosity than the ordinary customer and finally went out without making a purchase.
