Stock of Cohen & Seigel Is  
Sold by the  
Sheriff.

IT BROUGHT \$4,100 CASH

Two Men Suspected of Rob-

Yesterday morning the stock of the clothing firm of Cohen & Seigel was sold by the sheriff for \$4,100 cash to Isaac Rothstein of Eau Claire. There was a large number of bidders present. The bidding started with \$1,500 but soon reached the amount for which it was sold. The stock inventoried \$6,000 and there were attachments of over \$16,000 against it. The money will be held by the sheriff till the superior court directs a disposition of it. The attorneys for the different claimants will begin a fight for the proceeds on the 15th. Rothstein is an uncle of Cohen. It is understood that the stock will be disposed of by retail here in the city.

### Arrested on Suspicion.
