

MORE DISPUTE THAN CRIME.

Judge Edson Disposes of Several Neighborhood Rows.

James McCarter, arrested for assault in the third degree, was let off yesterday on paying the costs of the case. During the hearing of the case, which was very much mixed, there were several exciting happenings.

The complaining witness was Peter Westlund, but it turned out that McCarter had not assaulted Westlund, but a man named Lind. The scrap was over some paltry difference in land matters, but the whole affair was finally cleaned up by the defendant paying the costs, \$2.50 in all.

The cases against N. Slonim for injuring private property and for trespassing were again brought up and a case was instituted in connection, by Slonim against Jim Azinsky, the man that swore out the warrants against Slonim for assault in the third degree. After the cases were heard, the judge concluded that all it amounted to was a common family row, and dismissed all three cases.
