Turns Out Four Indictments and Hears Other Cases. The grand jury knows not when it will be through with the work before it. As soon as one case is disposed of another is ready for a hearing.

GRAND JURY WORKING STILL.

Several matters were up for investigation yesterday, including a libel case in which, T. Waldo Murphy, of Hibbing, seeks to bring Editor W. A. Thomas, of the Hibbing Sentinel, to terms for alleged libelous articles regarding Mr. Murhahv. Yesterday afternoon the grand jury returned four indictments, three only of which are ready for publicity. An indictment against Frederick Sjoseliuc for larceny in the second degree was found and the man is in the sheriff's custody. Sjoselius is accused of intent to swimlle Wolf Simon out of \$177.30 each and some property, for which Sjoselius was holding

in trust as an agent of Simon. Indictments were found against Thomas Baxter and William Tyfer for grand forceny in the first degree. The men are accused of stealing \$40 from Herman Hansen on the evening of April 7.
