

POLICE COURT NOTES.

Two Boys Convicted of Stealing a Bicycle.

Arthur Sheehan and Clinton Thorp, two young boys, were tried in police court yesterday for stealing a bicycle belonging to a son of W. A. Magonigle. The boys were both found guilty and sentenced to the state training school at Red Wing. Thorp, who is about 10 years old, was paroled for a year, pending good behavior. The boys stole the wheel last week, and after changing its color with paint, sold it in the West end.

Jacko Sims, a colored man, was arraigned on complaint of Lee Lewis for assault. The parties are denizens of St. Croix alley and the trouble occurred down there. Sims pleaded not guilty and was released on payment of \$15 bail. He will be tried today.

Joseph Polinsky and Louis Overkowsky, a couple of second hand dealers, were arraigned for doing business without the necessary license. Both pleaded not guilty and their hearings were set for Monday and Tuesday respectively.

Verner McLeod, a small boy from

Minnesota Point, was arraigned for striking a little girl named May Casey. Hearing was set for next Tuesday.

Fred Hankinson, Joseph Barthold, Charles Kiewer and Joseph Adams were sent to jail for drunkenness, and G. Sanders paid a \$12 fine for a similar offense.
