

## Oreckovsky Pulled on Various Charges Lately.

The Oreckovskys appear to be quite popular in police circles. Tuesday Louis Oreckovsky was arrested for not having a pawn license, and yesterday he was arraigned in court again for failing to procure a license for his dog. He pleaded not guilty and his hearing was set for Monday. Joseph Oreckovsky, a peddler, was arrested and arraigned for violating the health ordinance, by throwing a quantity of garbage back of his house, at No. 321½ East Fifth street. He pleaded not guilty and the case was set for Tuesday.
