

# FEAR OF PARENTS DRIVES BOYS TO JAIL

**Louis Goldish and Fred Levine, Aged  
Eleven Years, Apply to Police  
for Night's Lodging.**

Louis Goldish and Fred Levine, both about eleven years of age, called at police headquarters last night at a late hour and asked that they might be allowed to sleep there, giving as their excuse that their parents had gone into the country, and that they were afraid to sleep in the house alone. From the actions of the little fellows their story was not believed, several contradictions being made in telling the tale, but they were given a place to sleep.

About midnight Louis Goldish, a fish peddler, called up headquarters and asked if anything had been seen of two boys who answered the description of the youths asleep in the station. He was informed that they were there and came down to take them home.

He said one was his son, to whom he had given a sum of money with which to pay a debt. He claims the youth was influenced by the other to spend the money and was afraid to face the parental wrath, preferring to go to the station for shelter.
