

YOUTHFUL HORSETHIEF PAROLED

ARCHIE M'DONOUGH'S MOTHER INTERCEDES FOR HIM.

COURT HAD SENTENCED HIM TO SCHOOL FOR ONE YEAR.

Camille Schambo Must Answer to Serious Charge—Hagen Goes to Jail.

Archie McDonough, the fourteen-year-old St. Paul boy who hired a horse and buggy at Nichols & Thomas' livery stable Sunday, and endeavored to sell it at a lumber camp near the Knife river, was tried before Judge Edson yesterday, and found guilty. His mother, Mrs. Elizabeth McDonough, told the court an effort would be made to keep the boy out of mischief hereafter, as a result of which he was paroled for a year. In case of misbehavior he will be sent to the state training school.

Camille Schambo, a nineteen-year-old switchman, was arraigned in court on a grand jury charge, in which a fifteen-year-old West End girl is concerned. Schambo's examination was set for tomorrow afternoon, and, in default of \$250 bail, he was committed to the county jail.

Julius Hagen, who is charged with the theft of some clothing from Joseph Sosnovsky, was arraigned, and his examination set for this afternoon. Bail was fixed at \$250, in default of which he went to jail.
