

JUNK DEALER ARRESTED.

**Charged With Running His Store
Without a License.**

Louis Karon, a junk dealer at the foot of Eighteenth avenue west, was arrested yesterday, charged with running a second-hand store without a license. He pleaded not guilty, and will have his trial Friday.

The police say that Karon bought a quantity of old iron from some boys who have been committing depredations down on Garfield avenue. About twenty gamins, in all, were interested. They stole three wagonloads of iron from the National Iron Works, and disposed of it in small quantities. The boys ranged in age from six to sixteen years, and received in payment for their plunder sums of from five to fifty cents.

A city ordinance makes it a misdemeanor for dealers to buy old material of any kind from persons under sixteen years of age. It was found, however, that this does not apply to any but dealers holding licenses, and, as Karon is not in this class, he could not be prosecuted under the ordinance. Accordingly, a warrant was taken out charging him with running without a license.
