

# ADMINISTRATION CANDIDATES ARE SUCCESSFUL IN SUPERIOR

IRVINE L. LENROOT.



Who Scored a Victory Yesterday Over Roach.

The endorsement for nomination of Speaker Irvine Lenroot and Wallace Andrew for the assembly, the controlling of the county convention by the La Follette forces and the sending to the congressional convention of a half-breed delegation, instructed to work for Jenkins, was the result of yesterday's Republican caucuses in Superior and Douglas county.

The people showed their confidence in Governor La Follette by giving the delegations which represent him a large popular vote and that they believe Speaker Lenroot and Andrew should be sent back to support the governor in some of the measures more than apparent.

The anti-La Follette forces, and particularly the supporters of Ed Roach made a good fight, but they were swamped. Nevertheless, considering the record Speaker Lenroot has made in the assembly and his strong support, assisted by the large normal majority for La Follette it is contended that Mr. Roach's showing was one he need not be ashamed of.

Only one voting place in the county turned down the administration delegation—Nebagamon, which will send its seven delegates instructed for Ogilvie and Baensch.

## Ward Caucuses.

In the First ward the fight between the Pickering and Andrew forces was a close one, 294 votes being cast, of which Andrew received 165 and Pickering 129. The LaFollette forces had no opposition in this ward, both the Pickering and Andrew delegates having endorsed them. The delegates elected were as follows:

It was expected that Roach for the assembly would make a close fight in the Fourth ward, but of the 500 votes cast Lenroot secured nearly two to one. The town of Nebagamon was one of the few brands saved from the fire and gave the Stalwarts a victory. Both Baensch and Ogilvie were given delegations by about a two to one vote. Brule did the reverse and Andrew and La Follette earned a victory by a good margin. In Superior township La Follette also won out. Sixty votes were cast and the La Follette forces received 45 to their opponent's 15.
