

TEA CONCERN IS BANKRUPT

**William M. Miller, Proprietor,
Fails With Liabilities of
\$2,724.09.**

William M. Miller, operating under the firm name of the Miller Tea company of West Duluth, filed a voluntary petition in bankruptcy at the office of the deputy clerk of the United States court yesterday morning. Miller alleges that his liabilities aggregate \$2,724.09, while his assets amount to only \$1,583.

In the schedule of assets, priority claims secured by law are listed as taxes due St. Louis county, \$9.50; John Miller, services as clerk, \$27. Secured claims are given as follows: C. A. Blanke Tea & Coffee company, secured by bond, \$424.59; St. Louis County bank, promissory notes amounting to \$75. Unsecured claims for merchandise purchased, money loaned, and rent amount to \$2,189.

Stock fixtures and personal property are listed at \$1,521, together with \$132 claimed under exemption.

Solomon Rubloff, of Virginia, who was declared a bankrupt in involuntary proceedings last Saturday has filed schedules showing liabilities amounting to \$4,704.17; assets, \$3,825; exemption, \$350.
