

WANTS MONEY OR ITS EQUIVALENT

Solomon Taran Has Peter Miller Arrested on Larceny Charge.

Peter Miller was arraigned yesterday in municipal court charged with grand larceny. His case was postponed until July 8 at which time he will be given a trial. Miller was arrested on a warrant sworn out by Solomon Taran, a Tower avenue merchant, who claimed that Miller succeeded in getting goods from him to the amount of \$30 and then refused to pay for them.

Taran claims that he continually asked Miller for the money or the goods, but was never given any satisfaction as to when he was to receive payment. Taran finally became tired and complained to the police. Miller when taken into court yesterday did not deny the fact that he had received the goods but the court put the case over to look up his record.

Dell Richardson, of Hawthorne, was in court yesterday for a hearing, but his case was put over until July 9. He is charged with conducting a disorderly house at Hawthorne.

David Hendrickson and Andrew Oyer were up in court on the charge of being drunk. Oyer was unable to tell how old he was in court yesterday morning and the judge gave him 15 days on the rock pile. Hendrickson was given a similar sentence which was suspended. Three boys hailing from St. Paul were arrested and brought into court as vagrants. They were dismissed on condition that they leave town.
