

LOCAL FIRM ENLARGES.

Expresses Great Confidence In the Future of Duluth.

Important changes have been made in Duluth's oldest fur house—Krojankers.

Robert Krojanker, the present owner, has sold a third interest in the business to Roland B. Worthington, who has until recently been connected with the advertising department of this newspaper.
