

SAX DECLARES EVELETH CAN BUILD CEMETERY

Solomon Sax, alderman-elect in the second ward, is interested in the proposition to secure a cemetery and is of the opinion that the state law gives cities a right to institute con-

demnation proceedings against land for this purpose, either within or without the limits. He refers to P. 54, Sec. 133, of the laws of 1905 for his authority and contends that the provision set forth there applies not only for the burial of paupers but for general interment purposes. He said today:

"I can show you where the city has a right to institute condemnation proceedings for a cemetery. I have shown

it to several of the lawyers of the city and I believe I am right. It does not seem reasonable that there should be no way of obtaining a cemetery for a city of 7,000 population. I am in favor of the city's taking action to secure a location wherever a suitable one can be found."

Mr. Sax is backed in his efforts to secure improvements by prominent residents of the city.
