

CHICAGO COPS HOLD BELLOCK

Man Is Wanted in Duluth For Assaulting and Robbing J. Altman.

George E. Bellock, wanted in this city on a charge of brutally beating and robbing Joseph Altman, a Bowery clothier, on the night of Nov. 18, was arrested in Chicago yesterday according to a telegram received by Chief Troyer from Chief Collins. Bellock refuses to come without requisition papers, and the necessary authority will be taken out at once and Bellock brought back to face a charge of grand larceny in the first degree.

James Kennedy, who is in jail in default of bonds for his appearance as a supposed accessory, will be given a hearing in municipal court at 2 o'clock this afternoon.

Two men entered Altman's store after 11 o'clock of the night of November 18 and asked to be shown mackinaw coats. While Altman was reaching for the garment the men pounced upon him, beating him almost into insensibility and knocking out several of his teeth. They robbed him of a \$10 gold piece, a \$5 bill and some small change.

Altman gave descriptions of his assailants, and the police began work on the case. No clues were struck until last week when Sergeant Wilcox arrested Kennedy as a suspect. Bellock was known to have been in the city at the time of Kennedy's arrest, and it is

believed he was within earshot when, taken into custody, Kennedy exclaimed, "I'm pinched," and that he took alarm and fled. Every officer in the city was engaged for a time in the search for Bellock, but his whereabouts was unknown until the telegram from Chicago yesterday announced definitely that he was in custody.

The police say they have a case against Bellock, that shortly after the assault he appeared in the store of I. S. Guinn, a clothier opposite police headquarters, and offered an old coat with a blood-stained sleeve as part payment for a new coat. Bellock's cap was found on the floor the next morning, one of the victim's teeth being fastened to it by threads.
