

SPEAKS OF PROSPECTS IN TOWNS ON RANGE

Solomon Sax, one of the early timers on the Mesaba range and alderman-elect in Eveleth, has just made a trip along the western end of the range, going as far as Nashwauk, and returns full of enthusiasm for next year's business prospects. Concerning his trip Mr. Sax this afternoon said:

"I went to Nashwauk by way of Wolf and Hibbing. Nashwauk is looking better than for a long time. A whole train load of people got off there. I presume they were going to the headquarters of the Alborn-Bovey road. In Hibbing I met Mr. A. G. Kingston. He says his company has three years' work at the Crosby stripping, and will employ 150 men. Of course, Nashwauk is very quiet yet, but it looks very favorable for the town. I have some real estate there and had some enquiries about it, that was my reason for making the trip.

"Passing through Hibbing members of the Commercial club met me and asked for pointers on the club. They have been watching our business men's association with great interest. For by-laws I referred them to the Chisholm club which has a copy of the by-laws of the Eveleth association.

"From Nashwauk I went to Chisholm. Chisholm looks good. The Commercial club there is working strong for the welfare of the town and is encouraging the finishing of the sewer.

"I have a lot there and would build a brick building on it if they would finish the sewer. From the appearance of things I should say the people of Chisholm are beginning to work with the council.

"From Chisholm back to Hibbing I went with R. Berdle, former county commissioner. He intimated he might be a candidate for representative for the 49th district at the next election. I have known Berdle for many years. He is an old friend of mine.

"All the towns along the range look good. They are glad they have Commercial clubs and that they patterned them after Eveleth's.
