

VEST POCKET CHANGE GONE

Matson Charges Taran With Larceny of \$200 From Gar- ment Sent to Cleaner.

Solomon Taran was arraigned in municipal court yesterday on the charge of grand larceny, preferred by Christ Matson, a saloonkeeper at 423 Tower avenue. He pleaded not guilty and the case was continued to Tuesday.

According to Matson's story to the police, Taran, who cleans clothes and is his own drayman dropped into Matson's place, while the latter was pondering over the question whether to buy a new suit of clothes or get the old one cleaned. He soon struck a bargain and Taran was on the way to his establishment a block away, having promised to make the clothes look as good as new within a few hours.

Shortly after Taran left the saloon Matson had occasion to cash a check, when he recalled that he had forgotten to take his pocketbook containing \$250 from his vest before giving it to Taran. Matson lost no time in going to Taran's place where he found that the vest had been cleaned of the money. Taran denied having seen any money or pocketbook in the clothing. Hence his arrest. Taran was released on \$500 bonds.
