

ORECKOVSKY GETS A VERDICT FOR \$200

Joseph Oreckovsky, a Bowery clothier, who had agreed to purchase a stock of merchandise from John Moir and others of the West End, and who refused to accept the goods because the sellers insisted that he should buy more men's shoes than he wanted, is entitled to \$200, the earnest money he paid before the parties started to invoice the stock. Judge Cant's jury in district court gave him a verdict for the amount yesterday in his suit against Moir, et al. The jury allowed him the full justice for which he sued.

The defendants claimed that they were ready and willing to complete the sale of the goods and also alleged to have been damaged by the plaintiff's refusal to accept the merchandise.

Herbert Dancer conducted the trial which lasted two days, and John Jenswold, jr., represented the defendants.
