

PROPERTY LOOKS LIKE A WINNER

I. Freimuth Speaks Encouragingly of the Superior & Butte Mine.

L. Freimuth of Duluth, who has just returned from Butte, Mont., and was a member of a party comprising Capt. A. B. Wolvin, J. F. Killorin, T. J. Davis and P. H. Nelson, was very much impressed with the great mining camp. The party spent a week inspecting the properties of the Butte & Superior Copper company, in which they are all interested financially. In an interview Mr. Freimuth said:

Is a Hustling Place.

"One cannot fail to be impressed with the hustle and life of Butte's business district. It is the busiest retail town of its size that I have ever seen. This is due to the large number of men employed in the different mines, which at present are working to full capacity. New mines are being opened up all the time. The most prominent among the new ones is Senator Clark's Posen and Elm Orlu, which adjoins the Butte & Superior property, and through which the Black Rock vein runs. I am not a mining man, and therefore not very competent to speak, but the Butte & Superior property looks good to me. I have gone over the claims held by the company, and have gone down in the Black Rock shaft, and all that I saw impressed me as being indicative of large and rich deposits in all the claims.

Is a Good Property.

I have talked with old and practical mining men of the Butte camp that are acquainted with every foot of the ground, and their opinion without exception was that the Butte & Superior has the best and most valuable property in the camp and is bound to be a rich producer of silver and copper."

Mr. Freimuth said that the Black Rock had a shaft 500 feet deep which is being enlarged and retimbered. It will take two months to accomplish this work, and then the work of sinking will be vigorously pushed. New machinery for the plant has been ordered and will be installed as fast as it can be delivered.
