He will have full charge of both the underground and surface work at the Larkin mine, formerly known as the Tesora. The mine is about a mile and a half from Virginia. It will be conducted under the milling system. Mr. Harris is an experienced miner. He has worked with mines practically all his life, having started to work when very young under his grandfather, a mining captain. He has been employed at the Lake Angeline mine at Ishpeming, Mich., for several years. For the past eight years he has served as shift boss. Mr. Harris is popular with the men. To show their appreciation 100 miners in the part of the mine where he has been boss recently presented him with a handsome surveyor's compass. Mr. Harris' family will reside at Ishpeming for the winter.
