

BURGLAR SUSPECT IS UNDER ARREST

Albert Schultz Taken In Rear End of Saloon When Owner Opened Up.

Albert Schultz, 24 years old, was arrested in Mulligan's saloon, 217 West Superior street, at 7 o'clock yesterday morning on suspicion of having attempted to burglarize the place. Papers found in his possession, it is alleged, helped to confirm the suspicions of the police that he was implicated in the three burglaries which occurred Wednesday night, and he will be taken before the grand jury today on a larceny charge. He denies his guilt.

When the proprietor of the saloon entered yesterday morning to open for business he found that the drawers in the back bar had been pulled open and ransacked. A noise in the rear room disclosed the presence of Schultz, who said he had just awakened from an all-night sleep in the place. His story was doubted, and the proprietor called an officer.

When searched at headquarters Schultz had an envelope containing \$2.75 in stamps, missed in the Sattler burglary, and a business letterhead of a firm doing business with the Sattler company. He also had a Macabee charm which the owner of the saloon says is his property.

Schultz had in his pocket a type-written letter very poorly spelled, which it is believed he had intended to leave in the Sattler company's office after the alleged burglary. It was to the effect that he regretted breaking into the Sattler store, that he fancied the rock and rye and complained because he found no champagne.

Schultz has been living at 313 West Fifth street.
