

# COMMENCEMENT SEASON IS NEAR

## Graduating Classes of City Schools to Render Programs During Next Week, Kimball Giving the First at School Friday Evening.

The opening of the commencement season for the city schools comes next Friday evening, when the Kimball graduates will give a program at that school Sunday morning, June 10, Rev. C. A. Wilson, rector of the Church of the Redeemer, of the East End, will preach the sermon to the graduating classes of the Blaine and Nelson Dewey high schools. Tuesday morning, June 12, the class day exercises of the Nelson Dewey high school will be held at the assembly room.

Tuesday evening, June 12, exercises of four grade schools will be held beginning at 8 o'clock, the Blaine entertaining at the Blaine, the Bryant holding forth at Odd Fellows' hall, in South Superior, the Lincoln at the Central Park Unitarian church and the Cooper at the Hope Congregational church, Billings Park. June 13 at 8 o'clock three more schools will hold their closing exercises. The Nelson Dewey grades will give their program at the assembly room of the school, the Howe graduates will appear at the Blaine assembly room and the Carpenter class will put on a program at the Ericsson assembly room. ## HABENICHT CASE ON TRIAL TODAY

### Heavy Calendar Called In Circuit Court Yesterday and Hearings Set.

Following the close of the Memorial exercises in honor of the late Judge Dickinson in the circuit court yesterday, the calendar for the term was called and a number of cases set for trial. The first of the suits to be tried is that of J. W. Habenicht vs. the Omaha road, which will be taken up before a jury this morning. Habenicht seeks damages for the loss of a horse which was killed by one of the defendant company's trains. The prisoners who have been bound over to the circuit court and who are confined to the county jail, will be arraigned this morning and given an opportunity to enter pleas to the crimes charged against them. The criminal cases will be taken up on Thursday and it is expected to have them disposed of one way or another by the end of the week.

During the hours of court yesterday Judge Vinje sustained a demurrer in the complaint of the action brought by John D. Young Lumber company against the Western Assurance company. Arguments were made on behalf of the plaintiff by Solon L. Perrin of Superior and by W. F. Shea of Ashland for the defendant. Owing to his exceptionally large number of cases on the calendar, it is expected the term will be an unusually long one.
