

VIRGINIA YET IN THROES OF POUND CONTROVERSY

German Mesberg to Introduce Another Ordinance.

VIRGINIA, July 28.—That the controversy over restraining of cows and other animals from running at large in Virginia is not dead is evidenced by the fact that another pound ordinance has been introduced in the council by German Mesberg. This ordinance has the approval of Mayor Eaton. It allows cows the freedom of the streets from 6 a. m. to 8 p. m., and defines the pound limits as the corporate limits of the city of Virginia and not only a part of the city. German Mesberg today expressed himself as confident of its passage and approval. However, he was of the opinion that it may be amended somewhat before all the aldermen approve it. It is understood he will not object to certain amendments affecting the time limits.

The ordinance now before the council will hardly effect any change in present conditions, as the animals are allowed to run at large during the day. Both newspapers have expressed themselves as against this.
