

BIG SCHOOL LOAN ASKED OF STATE FOR CHISHOLM

Delivery of Sewer Pipe Delayed and Contractor Has to Stop Work Temporarily.

CHISHOLM, Aug. 25.—The school board will make application to the state school board for the loan of \$70,000. The bonds will be paid as follows: Thirty thousand dollars in 1912, and \$5,000 each year thereafter until the whole amount is paid with interest at the rate of four per cent per annum. The site for the new school house in the village proper has practically been decided on. It will be located on block 10, in the Lonizeau addition, just south of the village.
