## Sosnovsky-Fox Suit Goes to Jury. Other Actions Adjourned to Monday.

The damage suit brought by Golda Sosnovsky against Joseph E. Fox to secure \$1,025 for alleged personal injuries sustained in the defendant's store by falling down a cellar way while examining goods, was given to the jury yesterday afternoon. Judge Cant called the case of the Western Land association against the Wisconsin Central Railway company after the previous case had gone to the jury. It is brought by the land company to secure what they consider a fair return for some land which the railroad company took for railroad purposes. The hearing was started at the time for adjournment and it will be taken up again Monday morning.

The case of Charles Maki against the Cleveland-Cliffs Iron Mining company was heard yesterday before Judge Ensign. The testimony was all presented to the jury by both sides and the attorneys for the defense moved to dismiss. In order that the motion could be argued the jury was given a respite until Monday at which time the court will make known its decision.

The case of John Hakman against the Oliver Iron Mining company was on trial before Judge Dibell. It is expected to be concluded Monday. Hakman is suing for \$20,500 for injuries which he claims to have sustained by being blown up by the explosion of a can of powder.
