

COOK LOSES HIS HABEAS CORPUS FIGHT

Judge Cant yesterday discharged the writ of habeas corpus in the case of Moses Cook, a local pawnbroker, and ordered the defendant remanded to the custody of the sheriff. Mr. Cook was arrested and convicted on a charge of selling jewelry at auction, contrary to the city ordinance, and was sentenced to pay a fine, but refused to settle, and was taken to the county jail. Habeas corpus proceedings were instituted to secure his release, but the writ was discharged yesterday. Mr. Cook will pay his fine.
