

COOK IS FINED; GOES TO JAIL

Pawnbroker Will Try to Gain His Liberty on a Writ of Habeas Corpus.

Judge Cutting yesterday handed down his decision in the case of the city vs. Moses Cook and assessed a fine of \$34.48 against the defendant. Cook, who is a pawnbroker at the corner of Fourth avenue west and Superior street, was arrested about two weeks ago on the charge of violating his license. He was accused of having sold jewelry which he misrepresented to the purchasers.

After being found guilty yesterday, Mr. Cook, to the surprise of all the court officers, refused to pay the fine imposed by the court, and took the alternative sentence of 30 days in the county jail.

His attorney, Albert Baldwin, argued before Judge Cant in the district court for a writ of habeas corpus, but owing to limited time, no decision could be reached. The arguments will be resumed on Monday.
