

SUPERIOR COURT JURY EXCUSED UNTIL JULY 8

The regular panel of jurors summoned for service during the April term of the Superior court were excused from duty until July 8 by Judge Smith yesterday. A few of the jurors who had been on the Duthey case were on hand yesterday morning, and were informed that their services would not be required until the date stated. The others were permitted to go some days ago subject to call.

Other than the trial of a few criminal cases there is but little business scheduled for consideration when the jury returns. George Frazier of the South Side, who is charged with a statutory offense, will probably be placed on trial. Harry Goodwin, charged with non support, will be given an opportunity to tell the jury what financial aid he has given his wife and family for several months. Goodwin is confined in the county jail.

M. P. Shay, who is charged with the robbery of \$400 from Larson's grocery store, and W. J. Foley charged with assault with a dangerous weapon will be placed on trial. While under the influence of liquor Foley got into an altercation with Max Wiener, a Jewish peddler. The latter sustained a severe cut in the back, said to have been inflicted with a piece of glass. Foley is a railroad switchman and has a number of friends in the city.
