

CANNOT SHAVE WITHOUT LICENSE

I. Goldstein Accused of Barbering Without a Permit—Warrant Issued for His Arrest.

A warrant was issued yesterday for the arrest of I. Goldstein charging him with barbering without having obtained a certificate of registration. The complaint was sworn to by President McDonough, of the state barbers' board of this city, and it is expected that Goldstein will be arraigned in court today. Goldstein's shop is located at 419 Tower avenue and according to Mr. McDonough he was told some three weeks ago to close the place.

President McDonough asserts that Goldstein is only an apprentice, it being claimed that he and his brother ran a shop at the place stated for some time up to a month ago. Goldstein was learning the trade in his brother's shop and when the latter moved across the street it is alleged that Goldstein started up a business of his own.

"I've been away from the city for the past three weeks and on my return today I find that Goldstein has been giving me the double cross," said President McDonough to Assistant District Attorney McKay, who prepared the complaint. "He has been doing business right along although told to shut up until he had passed an examination. I sent Secretary Whitaker of the state board into Goldstein's place this morning to get a shave so we might have the necessary evidence to prosecute."

"Did he get shaved?" asked the attorney.

"Just take a look at his face," replied Mr. McDonough, as he pointed to Secretary Whitaker, who sat in a corner of the attorney's office rubbing his face with both hands.
