

CROWD HONORS OLD SETTLER'S LAST RITES

The funeral of David Krasonovsky, an old resident of Superior, who died Saturday noon at his home, 610 Banks avenue, was held yesterday afternoon from the Hebrew synagogue, which was thronged with friends. The services were among the most impressive and imposing that have been held there and Rabbi Tremblatt in delivering the oration and eulogy spoke with much feeling. Rabbi Joseph Krasonovsky of Chicago, a son of the deceased, also spoke at the synagogue and at the Hebrew cemetery where interment took place.

Mr. Krasonovsky was 67 years of age and had resided in Superior for the last 16 years, having come direct to Wisconsin from his former home in Russia. For the greater part of the time here he has conducted a clothing business. He had not been in good health for some months, and several weeks ago submitted to an operation with the hope of regaining his strength. This he apparently did, but a few days ago he became ill and death followed Saturday from congestion around the heart, inducing heart failure.

Mr. Krasonovsky is survived by three daughters and two sons. The daughters are: Mrs. Sarah Skversky, 610 Banks avenue, with whom he resided; Mrs. L. Bazelon, 507 John avenue, and a married daughter, Rachel, who lives in Russia. The sons are Rabbi Joseph of Chicago and Max of Milwaukee.
