## Former Duluth Woman Dies.

Mrs. H. S. Mills, formerly of Duluth, is dead at her home, 400 Iglehart avenue, St. Paul. She is survived by her husband and one daughter.

## Mining Man Visits Duluth.

Nelson J. Ness, a mining man of Helena, is at the St. Louis. He was formerly in the stone business in St. Paul, and says that he shipped the footing walls for the St. Louis hotel from that city 20 years ago.

## Dies of His Injuries.

Charles Walt, the St. Louis hotel employe who fell down an elevator shaft in the hotel last week died at St. Mary's hospital early yesterday morning as a result of the injuries. His back was broken and several ribs were fractured.

## Is Appointed Guardian.

## Lands Are Granted.

Senator Clapp has secured the passage of a bill granting to the diocese of Duluth lands now occupied by it for church purposes on Indian reservations in Minnesota. About a dozen small tracts are embraced in this grant, scattered through all reservations in the northern part of the state.

## Early Morning Blaze.

Fire at 6 o'clock yesterday morning slightly damaged the Saratoga hotel, Sixth avenue west and Superior street. The building is being torn down for the Wisconsin Central right of way and the blaze was discovered in the basement. The building has been abandoned for some time.

## Begins Suit for Damages.

Suit against the Mohawk Mining company at Aurora for \$15,000 damages alleged to have been sustained by George Danilak in the Mohawk mine last October, was begun in the district court yesterday through John H. Heino. Danilak alleges that he was caught in a defective piece of machinery and suffered serious and permanent injuries.
