

CHARGED WITH BUYING SOME STOLEN PROPERTY

ASHLAND, April 30.—Benjamin Milavitz, proprietor of the Chicago Iron & Metal Co., was bound over to the circuit court this morning on the charge of feloniously buying stolen property and aiding in the concealment of the same. His bonds were fixed at \$300 which he furnished.

This is the case, growing out of the recent thefts of old brass from the Wisconsin Central railroad company by employes who in turn sold the stolen property to Milavitz. As the result of catching the culprits who stole the brass, young Jones and Shonts were sentenced to a year each in the Green Bay reformatory, Arthur Seegar, who also was implicated, was fined \$100 and now Milavitz is bound over for receiving the stolen goods. The thefts began last November and lasted until April 6th when the officers got track of the thieves and took them into custody. The three employes of the Central pleaded guilty to the charge and were sentenced last week.
