

# HURLED INTO LAKE WORKMAN DROWNS

---

Julius Zalk, Probably Stunned by  
Heavy Blow, Sinks With-  
out a Struggle.

Hurled from a box car which he was unloading in the yards of the Duluth Iron & Metal company, yesterday morning, Julius Zalk, brother of Max Zalk, president of the company, fell over the wharf into the lake and was drowned.

Another laborer, S. Cohen, was also precipitated into the lake but managed to crawl up on the dock. The men were unloading a car of iron at the foot of Third avenue east near the water's edge. A large strip of sheet iron tipped over, catching the two men.

They were thrown in the air several feet and both fell into the lake. It is believed that Zalk was stunned by the blow as he did not struggle, and sank immediately. The body was recovered a few minutes later by the police with grappling irons.

Coroner McCuen ordered the remains removed to an undertaking establishment after an inquiry had been made. The dead man was 25 years old and unmarried. He lived at 320 Seventeenth avenue east.
