

DENIES HE WENT INTO FREIGHT CAR

William Whittaker Pleads Not Guilty—Milkman Pays for the Horses Injured.

William Whittaker was arraigned in Judge Parker's court yesterday where he waived examination on a charge of attempting burglary and was held for trial at the June term of the circuit court. In default of \$300 bail the defendant was remanded to the county jail.

Special Officer Miller of the Northern Pacific road alleges that the defendant attempted to break into one of the company's freight cars.

Among the other minor court matters yesterday was a continuance for two weeks in the case of Ray Brand who is charged with attempting to kill Arthur Levenson. A team of horses "shot to pieces" \$2 worth of milk tickets for Martin Finstad, a milkman. Finstad admitted that his horses injured one of the city's shade trees and he paid a fine of \$3.

Sam Rosenberg failed to respond to roll call and \$10 bail put up by him when arrested on a charge of intoxication was declared forfeited.

G. E. Shelby and John Katon two railroad switchmen arrested Saturday in the round-up of suspects in connection with the Nelson murder case were arraigned on a charge of vagrancy to which they pleaded guilty and were released on a suspended sentence.
