

RELIEF FOR WOMAN WHO LOST CHILDREN

Mrs. Ralph Ginsberg Is Destitute.
Two Little Ones Drowned
in Cloudburst.

Mrs. Ralph Ginsberg, whose two children were drowned in the flood of Wednesday night, is in destitute circumstances, and is in need of immediate assistance. With her three surviving children, she has been receiving temporary aid from the Jewish people of the city, but the fund which was subscribed to assist the poor woman is now practically exhausted and the generous hearted people of the city will be asked to render the necessary assistance.

Contrary to the supposition of the public the Ginsbergs did not conduct a store at 304 East Third street, but were living in the basement at the time of the flood, when the family was driven into the street and her two little ones ruthlessly torn from her arms and drowned in the waters that came rushing down the hillside.

Ralph Ginsberg, the husband and father, is a shoemaker, and had left his family some time before the accident, to seek work at his trade on the ranges, and so far has not been heard from. Together with his long absence, the loss of her two little children, and her destitute circumstances Mrs. Ginsberg is driven nearly to distraction. The family had gone through the San Francisco disaster, where their property was all swept away, and the added calamity in Duluth, is sadly preying on the poor woman's mind, and she must have assistance quickly.

Some of the Jewish people of Duluth have asked the News Tribune to receive subscriptions for the relief of the family and any money or articles that can be made use of, will be gladly received at this office and turned over to Mrs. Ginsberg.
