

DEMANDS \$25,000 FOR HIS WIFE'S AFFECTIONS

Joseph E. Fox, a hardware dealer, says that his wife's love is worth \$25,000 and alleges, in an action filed in the district court yesterday, that Albert H. Polinsky, a jeweler at 413½ West Superior street, should pay that amount for alienating them.

Fox was married Dec. 12, 1904, and separated from his wife June 25, 1909. Last September he was granted a divorce on the grounds of the misconduct of his wife with a man other than Polinsky.

He thinks, however, that Polinsky is really the man to blame for his marital troubles and consequently wants him to settle.
