

# BIWABIK WILL HAVE BIG BUILDING SEASON

BIWABIK, Jan. 17.—Every indication points to the fact that Biwabik is to have a building boom this year.

Max Cohen, the merchant, announces that he will put up a two-story brick, 50-foot frontage, and will veneer a frame building that he now owns and which he will move onto the lot he recently purchased from Frank Lundeen.

The Biwabik Hardware company, owned by H. G. Seeley, of Biwabik, and J. C. Poole of Eveleth, is planning to erect a two-story brick on the two Main street lots they own. This would also be 50-foot frontage. This deal has not been consummated, but will likely go through in the near future, as the building now occupied by the concern is too small to hold the stock carried.

Several local people practically agreed to erect a 50-foot building that will contain an opera house, a large public hall, and have stores on the first floor.

With this start of three large buildings it is thought that others will also conclude to build, including the First National bank, which has had plans drawn for some time to build on the present site of the bank.
