

SUNDAY SHOWS GO OUT AT WASHBURN

**Bijou Proprietor Discontinues Ob-
servance of Jewish Sabbath.
Issues Edict to Saloonmen.**

WASHBURN, Wis., Feb. 20.—
Louis Latts, proprietor of the Bijou
theater in this city who was con-
victed in municipal court this week
for violating the Sunday closing law
by running his show after he had
observed the regular Jewish Sabbath,
has decided not to again try to run
Sunday, at any rate not for a time
at least. He now announces that he
will run the show every day of the
week except Sunday and he also
threatens to have anyone "pinched"
that operates a saloon on the Sab-
bath. Latts was arrested every Sun-
day that he attempted to run the
show. The first case was dropped
and the theater remained closed for
a time on Sunday. The theater two
weeks ago attempted to run but was
closed by the authorities and the
proprietor arrested. He was acquit-
ted. In the last case he was con-
victed. The case has been drawing
a great deal of attention. It seems
that the law that permits a man to
hold any day as his day of worship
and then allows him to work on the
regular Sabbath, did not work in this
case.
