

SOLOMON KANER IS DEAD AT HIS HOME

Leader for Many Years Among
Jewish-Americans Here Suc-
cumbs to Pneumonia.

Solomon Kaner, aged 70 years, died at 3:30 o'clock yesterday morning at his home 213 John avenue. Pneumonia was the cause of his death. The deceased is survived by his wife, four sons and six daughters all of whom were present at the bedside. The children are Mrs. L. Revelsky of Buhl, Minn., Mrs. B. Cohen of Stevenson, Minn., Mrs. E. Kenner of Duluth, Mrs. B. Karon, Mrs. J. Chucker, Miss Evelyn, Benjamin Kaner, S. Kaner, E. Kaner and J. Kaner.

Mr. Kaner had been a resident of this city for a score of years. He was for many years one of the leaders of his nationality in this city. Through his efforts many of the now prosperous citizens were brought from Russia.

The funeral was held yesterday afternoon at 2:30 o'clock from the Hebrew synagogue, Rabbi Tzplitz of Duluth and Rabbi Trembladt of this city performing the services. Interment was made in the Hebrew cemetery.
