

# WOMAN RELATES STORY OF SHAME

Mrs. Joseph E. Fox, in Alienation Suit, Tells Court of Her Immoral Life.

The \$25,000 alienation of affections suit of Joseph E. Fox against Albert Polinsky occupied the entire attention of Judge Dibell and a jury yesterday in the district court and at adjournment was still unfinished. O. J. Larson, attorney for Fox, is of the opinion that the trial will take two or three days next week.

Mrs. Fox was on the stand until nearly 3 o'clock in the afternoon and continued her strange tale on cross-examination by C. O. Baldwin, attorney for Polinsky.

She said she came direct from a house of questionable character to testify at the trial, that she has had intimate relations with Duluth business men, one of whom she stated maintains a house downtown as well as one at the East End, and that she has been an inmate of questionable houses in Wisconsin, Minnesota and Michigan.

Mrs. Fox has exhibited the utmost frankness in telling her story and laid bare circumstances of her life that few persons could be forced to give. One or twice she has shown signs of emotion as she related her tale of shame but most of the time she has retained perfect composure, although the story she told is one unfit for publication.

She was followed on the stand by her former husband and the plaintiff in the action, Joseph E. Fox. His testimony differed little from that of Mrs. Fox as to what has happened since she first wrote him revealing her intimacy with Polinsky.

During the day it was brought out that while keeping company with Mrs. Fox prior to their marriage Fox married his cousin, then 13 years old, and that his marriage to her was annulled but a few days before he was wedded to Mrs. Fox the second.
