WILL ELECT DELEGATES TO AMERICAN CONGRESS

Rabbi Maurice Lefkovits and
Solomon Dublick Are Candi-
dates in Today's Balloting.

Jews of Duluth and the range will vote for a delegate to the American Jewish congress, to meet in Washington, D. C., Sept. 2, for the purpose of defining methods for obtaining protection of Jewish rights in all lands, and for the securing economic reconstruction of the Jewish communities in the war zone.

There are two Minnesota candidates, Rabbi Maurice Lefkovits and Solomon Dublick both of this city. One of these will be elected today to represent Minnesota Jews in congress.

Each voter must pay 10 cents for his ballot at the time of voting. This money will be sent to New York headquarters to defray expenses of the congress. This will be the first time that such a meeting of Jews will have been held in 2,000 years. Both men and women may vote.

The following election districts and judges have been designated where voters may cast ballots.

Garfield Avenue and Michigan Street Synagogue—Polls open 2 p. m. to 6 p. m. Robert Buchman, Clerk, Ben Karon.

In towns outside of Duluth unless otherwise notified by the local judge, the time for opening and closing the polls will be from 2 p. m. to 6 p. m., on Sunday, June 19, 1917.
