

THREE AUTOMOBILES IN STREET CRASH

In Attempt to Avoid Collision
Two Cars Hit Third—Dam-
age Slight.

Two automobiles crashed almost simultaneously into the machine of Joseph Oreckovsky, 531 East Second street, last night as it stood at the curb on Superior street near Third avenue West.

The machine of L. A. Kennedy, 1915 East Fifth street, had been standing behind the Oreckovsky car. As the driver turned out the west-bound car of A. L. Blewett, 1906 West Superior street, came abreast. To avert an accident, Kennedy threw on his power and turned the machine into the side of the Oreckovsky car, throwing it onto the sidewalk and breaking the right front wheel. Blewett, to prevent a collision with the Kennedy machine turned by mistake toward the curb striking the first car in the rear.

No one was injured. Only the Oreckovsky machine was injured. In addition to the broken wheel, it suffered a bent left front fender and considerable damage to the rear.
