

# DULUTH BOYS WILL HELP Y. M. C. A. BIG WAR FUND

## Will Pledge Themselves to Earn and Subscribe \$10 Through Unaided Efforts.

Boys of Duluth will be very busy during the coming week opening up a campaign throughout the country for 100,000 boys to earn and subscribe \$1,000,000 for the help of allied soldiers participating in the war. Duluth's share of this immense undertaking will be large enough to keep the teams and committeemen moving every minute of spare time during all of next week.

They will endeavor to bring the proposition to every boy in the city who will be asked to sign a pledge card, which must be countersigned by the parent or guardian to earn every cent of the \$10 pledged himself. He cannot accept any donations or use any allowance to help make up the amount.

Much enthusiasm is being manifested among the workers who are steadily and quietly preparing for the launching of the campaign next week. A few cards are out now. The

boys who sign the cards pledging the \$10 will receive at once red triangle buttons which will read, "The First 100,000." When the full amount has been turned over to the local treasurer the boy will receive a certificate showing that he has subscribed \$10 for the Y. M. C. A. war work with our soldiers and soldiers of our allies.
